What is Title I?

Thurgood Marshall Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESSA). What is it?

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Thurgood Marshall Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan will be posted on the school website. As a reminder, we will send the plan to all parents in August and distribute it again during our scheduled Open House event and Annual Title I Meetings. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

Marshall Elementary is Branching Out!

Marshall Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:
